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GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The aim of this course is to teach the basic foundations of contemporary politics and history of Spain while also describing the main elements, which constitute the political system of the European Union. Starting with a basic method for interpreting the political reality, a dynamic understanding of the current workings of both Spain and the European Union as a whole is provided.

METHODOLOGY

METHODOLOGY

Lectures by the instructor, supported with bibliographical and other didactic materials, followed by debates with the students. The class will follow a seminar format. This presupposes that the readings assigned for each week have been made before we meet in class. At the beginning of each class, the instructor will introduce the materials and allow some time for questions of clarification. Thereafter, we will have a seminar discussion. Students will be invited to express their views on the materials for the class and the criticisms made during the presentation. Both the presentations and the discussions around them are expected to be respectful, professional and anchored in the class materials.

EVALUATION

Participation in class will account for 20% of the final grade. So STUDENTS are strongly recommended to actively participate in class. Active participation is also an essential part of the learning process, so in class you have a wonderful opportunity to exercise and enhance your ability to speak in public, which is an essential part of politics, education and citizenship.

Weekly assignments. The weekly assignments count for 20% of the final grade. These research papers are short analytical pieces of about one or two pages long, and the topic will be proposed by the instructor every week. Students will deliver the papers by e-mail before the fixed deadline. Late papers will not be accepted.

Exams. The mid-term and the final exam count each for 30% of your final grade. They will be in-class examinations which will primarily focus on the reading materials and lectures but will also ask for your point of view, and arguments backing it up.
